## James Orichosky Assumes Leadership of State Principals Association

(ENOLA, PA) — James E. Orichosky, Director of Elementary Education for Bald Eagle Area School District, Wingate, Pennsylvania, and Principal of Wingate and Mountaintop Elementary schools, is the 2024-2026 President of the Pennsylvania Principals Association. The Pennsylvania Principals Association is the only professional organization in Pennsylvania dedicated to the support and well-being of school administrators with a special emphasis on elementary, middle and high school principals. Mr. Orichosky has been a member of the association for 22 years. He began serving as the Bald Eagle Area School District's director of elementary education in 2013. Additionally, he has worked as a student teaching supervisor since 2019 for Walden University.
